There were a lot of red numbers this time; everyone must be sharpening up their skills with our annual championships coming up in a few weeks. Congratulations to Dan Ashby who was our low gross winner, with a nice 72. The competition was fierce; we had a tie for low net between Jerry Bruessel and John Nelson (net 62). We had to go back and review each hole on their scorecards to determine that Jerry was our low net winner.

We had enough players again to have four flights, the winners of those flights were: A Flight Ed Smith, B Flight Brian Hartmen, C Flight John Nelson and D Flight Sal Malandrino. The gross skins game had a \$310 pot and paid out \$62 to five winners. The net skins had a \$200 pot and that paid out \$50 for four skins. I also wanted to recognize Greg Howe who had one of the closets to the pins and also had only 26 putts for his round, very impressive.

We have a lot of good courses to play in the coming months, after our Championships at Northshore and Sweetwater we'll have Victoria Hills in June, Reunion in July and The Grand Cypress in August. These courses should attract new members so remember to invite other golfers during these months.

Our two-day championships are May 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>; we combine the scores from each day, giving you a total score. Last year we played at The Legends and Eastwood. **Know the rules**

**Play by the rules**

**Protect the field**

AGO members playing AGO tournaments should notify playing partners when they see rule infractions. When in doubt, play a 2nd ball through the hole, and check with a committee member after completing your round. Notifying someone of a potential rules infraction is NOT accusing someone of cheating. The person may not know the rules.

### 5-3. Ball Unfit for Play

A ball is unfit for play if it is visibly cut, cracked or out of shape. A ball is not unfit for play solely because mud or other materials adhere to it, its surface is scratched or scraped or its paint is damaged or discolored.

If a player has reason to believe his ball has become unfit for play during play of the hole being played, he may lift the ball, without penalty, to determine whether it is unfit.

Before lifting the ball, the player must announce his intention to his opponent in match play or his *marker* or a *fellow-competitor* in stroke play and mark the position of the ball.

He may then lift and examine it, provided that he gives his opponent, *marker* or *fellow-competitor* an opportunity to examine the ball and observe the lifting and replacement.

The ball must not be cleaned when lifted under Rule 5-3.

If the player fails to comply with all or any part of this procedure or if he lifts the ball without having reason to believe that it has become unfit for play during play of the hole being played, he incurs a penalty of one stroke.

If it is determined that the ball has become unfit for play during play of the hole being played, the player may *substitute* another ball, placing it on the spot where the original ball lay. Otherwise, the original ball must be replaced. If a player *substitutes* a ball when not permitted and makes a *stroke* at the wrongly *substituted ball*, he incurs the general penalty for a breach of Rule 5-3, but there is no additional penalty under this Rule or 15-2.

If a ball breaks into pieces as a result of a *stroke*, the *stroke* is canceled and the player must play a ball, without penalty, as nearly as possible at the spot from which the original ball was played (see Rule 20-5).

**\*PENALTY FOR BREACH OF RULE 5-3:**

**Match play** - Loss of hole; **Stroke play** - Two strokes. \*If a player incurs the general penalty for breach of Rule 5-3, there is no additional penalty under this Rule.

**Note 1:** If the opponent, *marker* or *fellow-competitor* wishes to dispute a claim of unfitness, he must do so before the player plays another ball.

**Note 2:** If the original lie of a ball to be placed or replaced has been altered, see Rule 20-3b.

(Cleaning ball lifted from putting green or under any other Rule - see Rule 21.)

## **13-4/28 Grounding Club, Moving Loose Impediments and Improving Area of Intended Swing in Hazard**

**Q. In stroke play, a competitor's ball is in a hazard. He takes a practice swing and in so doing moves loose impediments and touches the ground in the hazard. He also bends a shrub with his hand, improving the area of his intended swing. What is the penalty?**

**A. As a single act (i.e., the practice swing) resulted in two Rules being breached (Rule 13-4b and Rule 13-4c), in equity (Rule 1-4), a single penalty of two strokes is applied. However, the competitor also incurs a penalty of two strokes for improving the area of his intended swing by bending a shrub (Rule 13-2).**

**The practice swing and the bending of the shrub are different acts that resulted in the breach of two Rules and both penalties are applied giving a total penalty of four strokes.**
