4-4a Competitor Borrows Fellow-Competitor's Club

Q. In stroke play, Player A, who had mistakenly left his club at a previous hole, borrows a club from Player B, a fellow-competitor, and uses it. At the next tee, the Committee is advised of the situation. What is the ruling?

A. Player A was not entitled to borrow a club selected for play by any other person on the course — Rule 4-4a. Player A incurs a penalty of two strokes for a breach of Rule 4-4a and must immediately declare Player B's club out of play as prescribed in Rule 4-4c. If Player A recovers his own club, he may use it. Player B may have his club returned to him and use it for the remainder of the round.

25-1b/8 Player's Options When Ball In Bunker Completely Covered by Casual Water

Q. If a player's ball lies in a bunker completely covered by casual water, what are his options?

A. The player may play the ball as it lies or:

- (1) drop the ball in the bunker without penalty at the nearest point, not nearer the hole; or**
- (2) drop the ball behind the bunker under penalty of one stroke; or**
- (3) deem the ball unplayable and proceed in accordance with Rule 28.**
